Policy Statement

Wisdom College is committed to the management of student behaviour in a way that stresses prevention, support and the avoidance of confrontation. Wisdom College is focused on the development of positive student behaviour rather than on punishment for student misbehaviour.

Wisdom College has carefully selected an evidence-informed positive behaviour management approaches that align with the school community's needs.

Our approach and steps are clearly outlined within Wisdom College Behaviour Management Policy and Procedures

Responsibilities

School

Wisdom College will uphold and consistently apply the school's Behaviour Management Policy and Procedures

Employee

At Wisdom College employees have a responsibility to uphold and consistently apply the school's Behaviour Management Policy and Procedures

Student

At Wisdom College students have a responsibility to act in accordance with and accept decisions made under the school's Behaviour Management Policy and Procedures

Parents

We believe Parents ultimately have responsibility in how their children are raised and the importance of raising children and young adults to have good behaviour and character. This is especially important as our students are working within the home environment.

Implementation

Our staff are, however, often called upon to give behaviour management support to parents or encouragement directly to the student where the parent has requested such support. Our Behaviour Management plan also provides clear guidance for families who request this support.

Compliance and Monitoring

Ultimately if a student is not able to behave in an appropriate manner at workshops or similar event they will be asked to have their parent sit with them. If this does not improve the situation the student is not able to come to gatherings or group lessons until they can demonstrate a change in attitude and behaviour.
