Our Learning

The major focus was the development of thorough scope and sequence documents from Prep to Year 10 that was built around the Australian Curriculum. We also had our first cohort of Year 11 students who had commenced QCAA subjects. We therefore had a number of subjects to move through the process of accreditation which was successfully completed.

Our Community

As per previous years, our Community proved to be a major source of engagement as we delivered or hosted a number of events. This included Iftar Dinners, the Qurban Festival and the College Fete. We also delivered a wide variety of information sessions to our parents which included career planning, subject choices, and healthy parenting practices.

Our Facilities

There was a need to upgrade a number of areas of our College to ensure that we continue to provide not only a safe and comfortable environment but also engaging spaces to learn. We also built new playground spaces, and installed additional storage. We did a review of areas of high risk and then put a maintenance schedule in place to rectify these.

Our College is in a financially healthy position to enable us to continue to support growth and resourcing of programs well into the future.

OurSchool at a Glance

Wisdom College is an independent, nondenominational and co-educational school based at 97 Formby Drive, Calamvale QLD, 4116.

School enrolment in 2021 consisted of 318 students of which 169 were boys and 149 were girls from Preparatory to Year 11. 73% of the student population is early years and Primary students, and the remaining 27% of students are Secondary school students. The majority of our students come predominantly from Calamvale and Runcorn as well as Woodridge, Algester areas and some as far as Springwood.

We value the diversity of our students and the great majority of our students are from Turkish, Pacific, African, and Arabic backgrounds reflecting the diversity of Australian society.

Wisdom College offers a happy and safe learning environment where every student is welcomed and cared for warmly. Small class sizes facilitate tailored learning opportunities for our students.

One of the distinctive sides of Wisdom College is that the school invests in the latest technology as much as possible within its budget. This is so that students' learning is enhanced through the use of technology inside and outside the class. Wisdom College offers inclusive student welfare services through the Pastoral Care (PC) Department which aims to teach students moral values as well as soft skills. Throughout the year we organises various indoor-outdoor activities such as guest speakers, excursions and camps.

The school provides parents with an affordable schooling option, and a door to door bus service for the families who look for an alternative transport means at a reasonable fee.

We deliver all subjects as part of the Australian National Curriculum . We also offer the Arabic language and Religion and Values lessons.

We are committed to the formation of a non-denominational school where we believe that the most important aspect of a school is its humanity. Management of Non-Attendance:

Teachers are involved in the monitoring of students through roll call which has enabled early intervention in case of absences. Parents are requested to provide a note to the teacher immediately after the child returns to school. Parents are informed of any outstanding notes. Parents are encouraged to arrange medical and other necessary appointments outside school hours. Regular school attendance is a significant contributor to quality learning outcomes and success at school.

We have an electronic attendance system based on integrated software called TASS to improve the

accuracy and monitoring of student attendance. Student non-attendance is monitored by class teachers. The roll call result is immediately sent to the Administration Office via TASS software.

The school then sends text messages to parents in order to seek information on the whereabouts of their children. Prolonged periods of absence occur from time-to-time where students travel overseas. Common reasons for nonattendance include extended overseas family holidays and illness as well as the Covid-19 pandemic which was from end of March 2020 till early June 2021.



Key Academic Achievements and Developments



Year 10 Retention

At the end of 2021, Wisdom College was able to retain 100% of the Year 10 cohort who are now completing their senior schooling at the College.

Vocational Education and Training

In 2021 four students completed their Certificate II in Health Service Assistance through Mater Education at the Mater Hospital. Two Year 12 students further went on to complete the Certificate III in Health Services. In addition we had a student complete a Certificate I in Construction at TAFE Skills Tech at Acacia Ridge; a student complete a Certificate III in Information & Digital Technology; and a student completed a Certificate IV Business.

NAPLAN

The 2021 NAPLAN results are presented in the table/graphs below. The Year 3 and 5 students have performed at the national standard across the writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy bands with our students above the national average in writing Year 3 and spelling Year 5. Across the year levels our students have performed below the national average in reading. The Year 7 and 9 cohorts have performed below national average in all areas except for spelling.
