FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Term 3 has come to an end and we have much to celebrate, and plenty of things to prepare for as we look towards Term 4.

Firstly, I would like to thank all staff for another busy and engaging term of learning. We have had a number of events, activities, and projects through the past few months, all of which has made our classrooms vibrant places to be. The Term has culminated in an Athletics and Sports Carnival for all year levels, and a Semi-Formal for our Year 11 students. Both of which were wonderful events to finish off the Term.

Over the holiday break we will be knocking down G Block, putting new carpet into some classrooms, doing painting and landscaping. We have relocated our music room and our prayer room to accommodate these changes. We are also preparing for the installation of 4 new classrooms at the end of this school year.

Term 4 commences on Tuesday 4th October. This will also see our new Head of Secondary commence duties with us. Mr James Easthope joins us from John Paul College and comes with a wealth of experience as an educator. Mr Easthope will also be teaching Health and Physical Education across grades 7 to 12. Ms Jayne Gillespie remains with us, and she will take on the role of Head of Operations.

Parent Teacher interviews will be on Friday 14th October, which is the end of Week 2 Term 4. This will be a student free day. Interviews will need to be booked online and information on how to do this will be sent separately to all families. Online bookings will apply to all year levels and these can be made from 9am to 4pm.

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Finally, all families will receive a letter providing important information around some topics that we need to explore in 2023. These are topics around Respectful Relationships and Consent Education. These topics are mandatory and compulsory for all Queensland schools both public, Catholic and independent from 2023. We have not commenced this as yet, but we need to start preparing for it. Unfortunately, across all spheres of Australian society, both public and private, there have been numerous occurrences of domestic violence, sexual assault, coercion, and immoral conduct. Despite a range of public health initiatives, it is not abating, in fact it has become worse. As a result, earlier this year education on consent was made mandatory in all Australian schools from 2023, after state and federal ministers unanimously agreed to enshrine it in the curriculum. Further to this, we have a moral responsibility as educators to support the young people under our care to navigate these topics. I must stress, this does not mean sex education. I know that this is a sensitive topic for many families, and is especially so amongst many of our various cultural and religious community groups that come together at Wisdom College. Its a sensitive topic for everyone, regardless of background. This is why I am writing to all parents to provide further information around this, details on how we intend to approach it, methods we will employ to be culturally appropriate, and to invite further dialogue.

I hope that everyone has the opportunity for some time to relax and refresh over the next 2 weeks of the school holidays. This includes students, staff and parents. I will see you all from the start of the new Term - Tuesday 4th October. The College office will be open over the holiday break and will be staffed.

Our grade 12 students undertook their mock exams last week and gained valuable feedback on their assessment in preparation for their external examinations next Term. In Term 4, Grade 12 students will move to a tutor style class session instead of regular classes in preparation for their external examinations. Our Grade 11 students also sat a 'Block' examination period which allowed them time to study and focus on one content area and exam at a time. Grade 11 students will officially begin their Unit 3 studies in term 4. This is the first unit of work which contributes to ATAR scores if this is the path a student is taking.
