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PARENTING IN THE DIGITAL WORLD PART 2

CHECKING OUT THE APPS:

The digital world is all about apps. Apps are growing like mushrooms and there's pretty much an app for just about anything you care to name. Apps are convenient, they're fun, they entertain, they save us time, and kids love them. But how can we check if an app is suitable for our child's developmental age?

A good place to start is by checking on The Australian Council on Children and the Media (ACCM) website http:// children and media. org.au/app-reviews/ ACCM hosts reviews of Apple App Stores apps, Facebook apps, Google Play apps and a section on what to know before you load app reviews. You can join in discussions on the ACCM website, suggest an app for review or provide a review. ACCM also provides a comprehensive range of fact sheets on all aspects of children and the media. http://childrenandmedia.org.au/ resources/fact-sheets.

Another good site to check out is Common Sense Media – a San Francisco based non-profit organisation providing education and advocacy to families to promote safe technology and media for children. www. commonsensemedia.org

SO WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT A 'DIGITAL REPUTATION'?

The significance of a 'good reputation' can often be lost on kids. Kids are kids and they will always do things that are out of left field, or experiment with experiences just because they can. Life can forget these growing pains, and their (unrecorded) adolescent footprint of inappropriate behaviour or decisions becomes a thing of the past. Part of growing up, we say.

But a digital reputation is different. What kids do online – what they post, the sites they visit, the things they say – is permanent. A child's digital footprint denotes their digital reputation (whether they like it or not) and based on what people find, their reputation can either be degraded or enhanced. The reality is that anyone can surf the internet and follow your child's digital footprint.

If we unpack what a digital footprint looks like, it's often made up of a profile picture on social networking sites (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, Snapchat etc.), 'likes' on social networking pages, the wording of email addresses, contributions to blogs, references and images on school blog sites and E-newsletters, or for older kids, their CV or online application form. Various webbased games and apps also lay a digital trail. There's nothing to stop someone saving and storing information about your child... information that can't be deleted or erased.

WHO IS RESPONSIBLE?

Kids are ultimately responsible for their digital footprint. But so are we as parents.

For kids, one of the more enjoyable aspects of setting up email and other accounts is creating a 'cool' login username or password. Whether our kids like it or not, as parents, we require to know(and in the case of younger kids, supervise) the creation of their email addresses and passwords. Not because we're snooping, but because an inappropriate email address sends the wrong message...before the email is even written.

Kids under thirteen cannot legally have their own email account with Gmail and Yahoo! Mail. If your child is primary-aged, helping them to create an email address is recommended. Stay clear of birth dates, full names, or any other way they can be identified. If they want something quirky make sure its respectful quirk and not too silly.

GETTING THE SETTINGS RIGHT

Kids of 13+ are usually sure they can set up their own accounts, (and most know how to!) but parental supervision is essential for this little exercise. When helping our teens to set up accounts, take note of which social media sites only offer limited security. Even though security can be set at different levels to limit who might see what, there's still no guarantee of privacy, especially if our kids' friends share their uploaded information with other kids.

If our kids want their own Facebook page (and most do) help them to protect their reputation. Silly or sexy selfies are not on, nor are any other images that provide a link to our child's address or contact details. It's OK for kids to have friends on Facebook for example, but it's advisable to hide our child's friends from public view. It's a good idea to always protect photos being viewed by the public or by friends of friends, and if our kids want to allow themselves to be tagged, set the tag so it has to be approved by them first. Similarly, with 'likes' we need to ensure that our kids understand that by ticking 'like', they agree totally with what's on that page.

Remember to regularly check account settings, un-tag or delete inappropriate images, and regularly google our kids and deal with anything potentially damaging or hurtful that the search might find. Contact the site immediately to request any offensive information be deleted. Also delete old or unused accounts. Kids can often be relaxed about security. As parents, we need to ramp up awareness and continually monitor.

CYBERBULLYING SUCKS

Cyberbullying can be hurtful and distressing. It can also contribute to poor performance at school, physical illness and in more extreme cases, serious mental health issues.

Cyberbullying can include: • abusive texts, emails and tweets • forwarding emails and attachments without permission • posting hurtful comments or pictures • 'sexting' (sexually explicit images) • setting up accounts and pretending to be that person • intentionally spreading untrue gossip on Social media.

Signs of bullying include: • not wanting to go to school • changed patterns of internet or mobile use• receiving text messages at odd hours or more than usual • secretive online behaviour • schoolwork not completed or lower marks • mood changes • having trouble sleeping and nightmares • spending less time socialising with friends • withdrawn and uncommunicative.

TACKLING CYBERBULLYING

When kids are bullied, it can be difficult for them to tell parents. Bullies rely on kids feeling isolated and harassed and not having the confidence or courage to speak up and seek help. Hopefully our kids will come to us should bullying of any kind happen, and when they do it's very important that we stay calm, offer support, and commit to getting to the bottom of the problem.

It can be difficult to stay calm, but tackling bullying requires a clear head and a strategy plan. • Don't threaten to remove the computer or take the mobile phone away. • Change passwords if you have to or get a new phone number. • Elicit what happened, who your child thinks is involved and whether they have thought to keep copies of the offending texts and tweets. • Keep copies of as much evidence of bullying as you can. • If the bully is known, block and delete that person from contact lists. • Don't retaliate or reply. • Click the 'report abuse' button. • Notify the school. • If one of your kid's friends is being bullied, we can encourage our child to stand by that friend by not forwarding messages or pictures, talking to the friend, and supporting them and getting information on how to handle cyberbullying.
