# New way to pay your school fees

We are always here to assist with any concerns and will work closely with Edstart for a smooth transition.

With Edstart Plus, families will have access to more options with their school fee payments, including:

- Options to pay weekly, fortnightly, monthly, termly, or annually by selecting the schedule that works for them
- The ability to choose a preferred day for when payments are made
- The option to spread your fees across the school year over a full 12-month period.
- The flexibility to adjust payments at any time
- Edstart pays the school up front for your fees, while you continue to have flexible payment terms
- Annual payers will still receive an early payment discount if paid by the due date

There are no fees or charges for using Edstart Plus for your Wisdom College fees. This is not a credit product and will not appear on your credit file or history. All families are required to have set up their Edstart account by Monday 27th November, in preparation for payment of fees in Term 1, 2024.

### THE EFFECTS OF TOO MUCH SCREEN TIME MRS. MANJA WHALEY - STUDENT SUPPORT OFFICER

And just like that we are back at school after our spring break! For most this means going back to a 'normal' routine of school uniforms daily, homework, going to bed early, chores to be done and less screen time to make this happen. Limiting screen time can be tricky especially after kids have had a break...

Furthermore, today's children have grown up with a vast array of electronic devices at their fingertips. They can't imagine a world without smartphones, tablets, and the internet. This means that today's parents are the first generation who have to figure out how to limit screen time for children. While digital devices can provide endless hours of entertainment and they can offer educational content, unlimited screen time can be harmful.

Here is what some of the research says:

- Obesity: Too much time engaging in a sitting down activity, such as watching TV and playing video games, can be a risk factor for becoming overweight.
- Sleep problems: Although many parents use TV to wind down before bed, screen time before bed can backfire. The light emitted from screens interferes with the sleep cycle in the brain and can lead to insomnia.
- Behaviour problems: Primary school-age children who watch TV or use a computer more than two hours per day are more likely to have emotional, social, and attention problems.
- Educational problems: Primary school-age children who have televisions in their bedrooms do worse on academic testing.
- Violence: Exposure to violent TV shows, movies, music, and video games can cause children to become desensitized to it. Eventually, they may use violence to solve problems and may imitate what they see on TV.

HERE ARE A FEW HOUSEHOLD RULES YOU MIGHT WANT TO ESTABLISH TO CURB SCREEN TIME:

- NO DIGITAL DEVICES DURING FAMILY MEALS.
- NO SCREEN TIME IN THE CAR ON THE WAY TO SCHOOL.
- NO SCREENS ALLOWED IN BEDROOMS.
- NO ELECTRONICS USE DURING FAMILY FUN NIGHTS.

In addition, consider an occasional digital detox for the whole family. Create a screen-free night once a week or commit to unplugging one weekend a month. It could be good for everyone's physical and emotional health as well as your family's relationships.






