Wisdom College first opened its doors in 2012 with less than 100 students and about 8 staff in total and it was a Primary School only. Many years before the actual opening, the vision for the College was established by the local Turkish Muslim community. Today we have 450 students and 45 staff spread across both Primary and Secondary grades. Wisdom College has sister schools across both Australia and the rest of the world and all of them are founded upon the philosophy of Hizmet.

Hizmet is a non-religious social and civic movement whose goals are to promote understanding, peace, co-existence, and service to others. Founded by Fethullah Gulen in Turkey in the mid 1960's it does have core Islamic values at its foundation.

We are proud of our heritage, our Hizmet history, and of the vision of our founders. Its one of the reasons why we have recently changed the names of our 4 Houses to align more with our Islamic history.

Each of our Houses are named after prominent Islamic scholars, historians, or female warriors:

- FARABI RED IN HONOUR OF MUHAMMAD AL FARABI – ASTRONOMER AND PHILOSOPHER
- AZWAR YELLOW IN HONOUR OF KWALA AL AZWAR – A FIERCE FEMALE WARRIOR
- SINA BLUE IN HONOUR OF AVICENNA SINA MEDICINE AND MATH
- KHALDUN GREEN IN HONOUR OF ZAYD KHALDUN – ECONOMICS AND HISTORIAN

Its also one of the reasons why we have a service learning

New way to pay your school fees

We are very pleased to share that Wisdom College has partnered with Edstart to improve the fee payment experience for families. From Term 1, 2024, ALL FEE payments to Wisdom College will be made through the Edstart platform.

Whilst we put our resources into the highest quality education, sustainability and continued new initiatives, Edstart are the experts in their field and are best placed to support our families with fee payment options moving forward. We are always here to assist with any concerns and will work closely with Edstart for a smooth transition.

With Edstart Plus, families will have access to more options with their school fee payments, including:

- Options to pay weekly, fortnightly, monthly, termly, or annually by selecting the schedule that works for them
- The ability to choose a preferred day for when payments are made
- The option to spread your fees across the school year over a full 12-month period.
- The flexibility to adjust payments at any time
- Edstart pays the school up front for your fees, while you continue to have flexible payment terms
- Annual payers will still receive an early payment discount if paid by the due date

There are no fees or charges for using Edstart Plus for your Wisdom College fees. This is not a credit product and will not appear on your credit file or history. All families are required to have set up their Edstart account by Monday 27th November, in preparation for payment of fees in Term 1, 2024.

To set up your Edstart account please use the link that has been emailed to you or visit edstart.com.au/wisdom The school will forward a copy of your invoice to Edstart each term, Edstart will then pay your school fees on your behalf when they are due.

Do I need to verify my identification during the setup process?

As Edstart's payment service is regulated by ASIC, we are required by law to verify your identity before setting up your account by cross-referencing the details on your credit report. This will not impact your credit file or your credit rating. Alternatively, you can provide your Driver Licence or Passport to complete this process.

Dear Parents and Students,

I hope this message finds you well.

I wanted to take a moment to remind everyone about a few important matters to ensure our school runs smoothly and everyone can make the most of their learning experience.

Firstly, Uniform Standards. It's important that all students wear the correct uniform in its entirety. We've noticed some discrepancies, particularly with socks and jewelry. Please remember to wear grey socks with the formal uniform and white socks with PE uniform. Additionally, girls, please limit jewelry to one set of earrings (one in each ear) and a watch. Boys can wear a watch but no earrings or other jewelry. Also, remember to wear formal shoes with formal uniform (not black sneakers). If your child has any medical conditions that may affect their uniform, please inform the college.

Next, our mobile phone policy is in place to minimize distractions and ensure a focused learning environment. Students are not permitted to use their phones at school except for emergency purposes. If they need to use their phone in an emergency, they can do so at their locker during break times only. Otherwise, they should ask a teacher to use one of the school-provided phones.

Lastly, being prepared for class is crucial for academic success. Please remind your child to charge their laptops every night for the next day and to bring writing materials and laptops to every lesson. Some subjects may also require textbooks, so please ensure

Student Use of Mobile Phones Policy

Background and Purpose

Mobile phones are a feature of society, and are in widespread use, allowing convenient communication and connectedness. We acknowledge that this form of communication is important but want to also ensure that good educational practice is not compromised.

At Wisdom College, we expect students to display the values of Respect, Integrity, Compassion and Excellence in all they do. We value interpersonal skills and recognise that at times mobile devices can get in the way of allowing students to develop to the degree that promotes quality person to person communication.

Scope

This policy applies to all Wisdom College students.

Policy Statement

This policy will provide students and staff with guidelines for the use of mobile devices at our college.

Procedures

- Students are permitted to carry a mobile phone to school.
- Upon arrival on campus and whilst at school, students are to securely place mobile phones in their designated locker.
- Wisdom College takes no responsibility for the loss of a mobile phone while the phone is at school. School resources will not be allocated to finding missing phones that are lost or allegedly stolen.
- 4. Students are allowed to access their mobile phones at their locker during morning break and afternoon break. At these times mobile phones are **only to be used in the case of emergencies** (for example, for contacting parents to advise that after school commitments have changed). To ensure punctuality and safety, students are not permitted to access their devices between lessons and when there is no scheduled break.
- Mobile devices are not to be used for texting, social purposes, social media, internet access or photos and videos during school time by students.
- 6. Inappropriate use of a mobile phone during the school day will result in confiscation of the phone. The confiscated phone will be labelled with the student's name and handed to Main Administration at the first opportunity. It can be collected at the end of the school day there.
- 7. Wisdom College takes seriously its responsibility to protect students and staff members from inappropriate or malicious on-line references. Significant or repeated misuse (three times within a given term) of a mobile phone by a student will be treated seriously and result in a parent meeting discussing this policy and setting goals to rectify behaviour.

In any matter where the college believes there may be material which is of a bullying, sexual, racial or in violent nature, or where students or the school is brought into disrepute, the College reserves the right to permit specified staff to inspect the device.

Thank you for your ongoing support, collaboration, and commitment to your child's education and well-being. Together, we make a difference in shaping their future..








FROM THE PREP CLASSROOM

Looking forward to a rewarding and successful year ahead.






























HEAD OF CO-CURRICULAR

Duration: 2 Nights 3 Days



Activities: Archery, Climbing tower, Crate stack, Low ropes, Camp fire reflection, Giant swing


