Happy End of Week 6!

I hope this message finds you well as we embark on the final four weeks of this term. Your continued support and cooperation make our school community thrive.

A quick note of appreciation for those of you who kindly wind down your car windows and share your child's name or display your tag during pick-ups. Your assistance streamlines our processes, making the transitions smoother for everyone. If you find yourself in need of a new name tag, please don't hesitate to inform your child's classroom teacher.

As the weather continues to remain warm, it's essential to ensure your child is equipped to handle the heat. Please remember to send them to school with a hat and a water bottle each day. In the absence of a hat, they'll enjoy playtime in the cool shade to stay safe and comfortable. Looking ahead, we ask you to schedule a time for the Parent-Teacher meetings during Week 8 and 9 Friday afternoons. These brief 15-minute slots are invaluable opportunities to discuss your child's progress and address any concerns. To ensure the meetings run smoothly for everyone, we urge you to be punctual and adhere to the allocated time slot. Your cooperation helps us keep things on track and respects the time of our teachers and fellow families.

NAPLAN Tests

As the NAPLAN tests approach, your child may experience some anxiety about the tests. It's important to reassure them that feeling this way is perfectly normal, but to not overstress. NAPLAN tests serve as standardized assessments taken by all students in Australia in Year 3, 5, 7, and 9, providing valuable data, yet their results don't impact academic report cards. It's advisable not to excessively prepare for NAPLAN; the curriculum adequately covers the material in previous years. However, if you believe supplementary materials might be beneficial, consider NAPLAN textbooks available at Big W, Kmart, and bookstores to support your child's preparation.

Thank you once again for your unwavering support and cooperation. Together, we create a nurturing environment where every child can thrive and succeed.

STUDY TIPS

As we're heading towards assessment time here are five handy study tips for Primary students.

- 1. Establish a Consistent Routine: Help your child create a study routine that includes designated times for homework, reading, and review. Consistency is key in building good study habits and helps children feel more organized and prepared for their schoolwork.
- 2. Create a Distraction-Free Environment: Designate a quiet, well-lit study area where your child can focus without distractions. Keep electronic devices away unless they're necessary for the task at hand. Minimizing distractions helps improve concentration and productivity.
- 3. Break Tasks into Manageable Chunks: Encourage your child to break down their assignments or study materials into smaller, more manageable chunks. This approach makes tasks feel less overwhelming and helps children maintain focus and motivation throughout their study sessions.
- 4. Use Visual Aids and Mnemonics: Introduce visual aids, such as flashcards





diagrams, or colorful charts, to help your child visualize and remember information. Additionally, encourage the use of mnemonics or memory techniques to recall key concepts or important facts more easily.
5. Encourage Regular Breaks and Movement: Encourage your child to take short breaks during study sessions to rest and recharge. Incorporating movement breaks, such as stretching or a quick walk, can help alleviate mental fatigue and improve concentration. Encourage them to stay hydrated and snack on healthy foods to keep their energy levels up.


Dear Wisdom Family

Vice-President


- The Vice President will support the President by:


