

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this message finds you well. As we wrap up the second week of Term 3, I wanted to share some updates and reminders with you. It has been wonderful to see our students return with enthusiasm and a positive attitude after the break. We are committed to fostering an environment of excellence and continuous improvement, and your support is invaluable in this journey.

Firstly, I would like to extend my appreciation for your ongoing cooperation and support. Our students have shown great dedication to their studies and school life, and this is a testament to the strong partnership between home and school. As we continue to strive for excellence, we have some important reminders regarding our standards and expectations:

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE:

Winter Uniform: Students are required to wear the College blazer and tie to and from school each day. This term, we are placing a renewed emphasis on uniform standards to ensure all students present themselves with pride, and represent our college and their family with dignity and poise.

KEY REMINDERS:

- Blazers are to be worn to and from school.
- Male students must keep their formal shirts tucked in at all times.

- Ensure that laptops are charged at home the night before school. Being prepared with a fully charged laptop is essential for a productive day of learning.

EXCELLENCE IN WELLBEING:

This term, we are focusing on "Excellence in Wellbeing." Every staff member is committed to understanding and supporting our students' wellbeing. We aim to help students regulate their behaviour and build confidence in their learning. Wellbeing activities will be integrated into Periods 3 and 5, including mindfulness breathing, journaling, colouring, progressive muscle relaxation, competitive games, and student check-ins. 
HEAD OF PRIMARY

Dear Wisdom Family,

Within primary we are implementing a new Social and Emotional learning program from prep to year 6. WISE @ Wisdom is based on the highly researched, global curriculum program Second Steps. It is our hope as a college that our students will not only leave Wisdom with a wealth of knowledge about the world, but a true understanding of themselves and those around them. WISE has already proven to help students navigate unwanted behaviours and reduced the number of unwanted behaviours from term 1 to term 2 as illustrated in the chart.

Together, we are teaching our students a variety of concepts they need to be successful. These being, skills for learning, Empathy, Emotion Management and Problem Solving. I have been incredibly happy to see and hear students using these skills in the playground and classroom to help navigate their day.

On Tuesday evening we held our first parent information night around Social Emotional learning. We discussed what the program is, how it can help your child, how you can help at home and had an open and collaborative discussion about concerns and queries. I would like to recap on the information shared for those families that were not able to attend. I will also post the slides from the evening and relevant research onto our Primary Hub for you to refer to.


Firstly, the WISE program is a whole college initiative that aims to promote the social-emotional competency and self-regulation skills of our students. The program has been designed by Second Steps to increase student success and decrease problem behaviours by aligning the lessons and skills to the 5 core To ensure that we are catering to all the learners of our college, our teachers have been working extremely hard to alter, adjust and change some features of Second Steps to support neurodivergent students. We are working together to create a toolbox of resources that ensure all students can take part and learn social skills in a way that supports their understanding and needs.

Each term, students will focus on a social and emotional skills they will need to be successful. Through ageappropriate lessons, games, conversations and activities students will be able to name the skills they need to learn, show and understand empathy, manage emotions and problem solve. Each of these topics are broken down into lessons and explored in detail. As a whole college we are reinforcing the lessons by modelling the skills to students, discussing it further at assemblies and celebrating students who are using the skills throughout their day.

With all aspects of students learning, we need you, their parents, siblings, grandparents to reinforce what they are learning in class, at home. Throughout the year, our teachers will be linking 'HomeLink' pages on their weekly reviews that go with several of the Second Step lessons. Home Links are simple, fun activities for you and your child to complete together. They are a fantastic way for you to understand what your child is learning and for your child to show you what he or she knows. By completing these activities together as a family, you are reinforcing to your child that these skills are important.

I am excited to see how this program will grow and develop at Wisdom. I am excited to see our students continue to develop these skills and build their social and emotional competency and I am excited to see you all at our next parent collaboration night; where we will be able to explore how Second steps is working for you and your child. 




