STUDY TOUR GROUPS:

This term, we have had the pleasure of hosting two Study Tour Groups from Japan. These visits have provided our students with vibrant cultural exchanges, enriching their educational experience and fostering international friendships. UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE:

- We also wish to remind all students of the importance of punctuality and preparedness:
- Arrival Time: Students should arrive at school by 8:30am, allowing them time to organise their lockers and be ready for the start of class at 8:45am. Late arrivals disrupt the learning process, so please encourage and support your child to be on time.
- Preparedness: Ensure that laptops are charged at home the night before school. Being prepared with a fully charged laptop is essential for a productive day of learning.


WISE TIP OF THE WEEK
