A reminder also that during Terms 2 and 3, our formal uniform expectations are in full effect. This includes students wearing their college tie and blazer when travelling to and from school, as well as at school assemblies, formal events, and other occasions where the full uniform is required. These expectations help maintain our high standards and ensure that our students are representing themselves and the College with pride.

Thank you to the many families who have supported the new Secondary Drop Off and Pick Up Zone. Since its introduction, we have seen a 50% reduction in congestion in the main car park, making it significantly easier for Primary parents to collect their children safely and efficiently. To keep this working smoothly, we ask families to please continue following these key guidelines:

- Do not park in the drop-off zone—please pull up, drop off or collect your child, and then move on promptly to allow space for other vehicles.
- Secondary students collecting Primary siblings should do so immediately after school and proceed to the pick-up zone to meet their parents.
- Please move forward to the first available cone to ensure the line moves efficiently and avoids traffic build-up.
- Do not stop on the corner of Formby Street—this presents a safety risk and contributes to congestion in the surrounding area.

We are grateful for your support as we continue to build a community where high expectations, mutual respect, and personal responsibility shape every student's experience. With your partnership, we're ensuring that Wisdom College remains a place of excellence—both academically and culturally.




