
<u>Futsal Program</u>

• The U12 Boys and Girls kicked off their first Gala Day on 22 May. A standout moment: the U12 boys secured a massive 22–2 victory!




• Our U14 Boys competed in the Queensland School Futsal Competition(QSF) at Coomera Indoor Sports Centre on 23–24 June.






